THE PLEASANCE

With an international profile and a network of alumni that reads like a Who's Who of contemporary comedy, drama and entertainment, the Pleasance is a place for the experimental and the new. It is where performers, writers, directors, technicians, producers and the rest of the artistic community can develop ideas and feel fully supported. It is one of the biggest and most highly respected theatre venues at the Edinburgh Festival Fringe and on the London Fringe circuit.

The Pleasance is both a Festival Organisation of 27 temporary venues across three sites and a London theatre and development centre in Islington, with three permanent performances spaces which operate in London year round. The Pleasance in London and Edinburgh are entirely symbiotic. The Pleasance Theatre Trust is not-for-profit, is a registered charity in England, Wales and Scotland, operating since 1985. The charity recieves no regular public subsidy.

PLEASANCE IN EDINBURGH

The Pleasance has become world renowned for spotting great talent. Each year, we mount an ambitious programme of theatre, comedy, circus, cabaret, dance, music and family shows. With over seventy percent of the progromme being debut or new productions, in venues under 200 seat capacity. This, often award winning, programme is now considered one of the entertainment industry's most important market places for new theatre, television and other festivals.

PLEASANCE COURTYARD

For many the Pleasance Courtyard is the very heart of the Fringe and few people leave the city without at least one visit, whether it be for theatre, comedy, children's shows, or simply to take in the irresistible atmosphere. Surrounding the famous cobbled squares and overlooking the picturesque Arthur's Seat, the Courtyard houses **17 performance spaces**, **6 bars and 3 cafés**. Open from 10am until late into the night, it is one of the only venues to offer the true festival day out. In 2019, the Pleasance welcomed **900,000 visitors**. PLEASANCE DOME

Since 2000, The Pleasance Dome and its **5 performance spaces** has fast become the central hub of the entire Festival. As evening falls the atrium and palm court is transformed into one of the festival's busiest nightspots, with live shows, music, food and drink keeping the crowds buzzing until 5am. The Dome is also home to the famous Brooke's Club, the original VIP bar of the festival. Performers, press and industry professionals share the membership with the stars of tomorrow doing deals over a drink and game of pool.

PLEASANCE AT THE EICC

Launched in 2016, Pleasance at EICC in Edinburgh's West End offers a home to some of the festival's most ambitious and technically complex productions. With performance spaces ranging from 100 to 1300 seats, the venue offers multiple opportunities for large scale international touring shows. Shows include Cirque ELOIZE, Cirque BERSERKE, and Freedom Ballet of Ukraine

PLEASANCE IN LONDON

The Pleasance's year-round home in London, Islington, has provided some of the leading talents in the theatrical, comedy and local community with a platform to develop work, hone their craft and grow new audiences.

The artistic programme at Pleasance London runs in parallel with Pleasance Edinburgh, with curated Comedy, Theatre and Family programmes. Pleasance London comprises **three performance spaces - the Main House, the Studio and Downstairs.** With capacities ranging from **54 - 230 seats**, these fully flexible venues provide performing companies with excellent facilities to develop and present a large number of productions and events.

Pleasance Futures is committed to discovering and supporting the most exciting new voices, nurturing the development of emerging companies, young performers, new writers and new producers.

THE CHARLIE HARTILL SPECIAL RESERVE

The Charlie Hartill Special Reserve is a designated fund to support emerging theatre makers and comedians in bringing their work to the Edinburgh Festival Fringe. The fund was established in 2004 in memory of Charlie Hartill and consists of three strands - the Theatre Reserve, the Comedy Reserve and the Generate Fund.





The Comedy Reserve supports new comic talent on the Fringe by selecting four emerging comedians and presenting them in a nightly mixed bill show in Edinburgh, without any financial risk. Previous recipients include Jack Whitehall, Jamali Maddix, Holly Walsh, Daniel Rigby, Roisin Conaty, Lou Sanders and Brett Goldstein.

THEATRE RESERVE

The Theatre Reserve provides a young theatre company with the rare and extraordinary opportunity to present a fully produced, groundbreaking performance at the Festival. Support includes financing, mentoring and programming options in our London transfer run post-Fringe. Shows include Olivier award winning *Flesh and Bone*.

GENERATE FUND FOR UK-BASED BLACK, ASIAN AND GLOBAL MAJORITY ARTISTS

The Generate Fund for UK-based Black, Asian and Global Majority Artists provides financing, mentorship and programming opportunities to support UK-based Global Majority artists in bringing their work to the Edinburgh Festival Fringe, to support exciting projects that would otherwise not be able to come. Shows include Block'd Off and Made in India Britain. "I was 18 when I first performed at the Pleasance, six months into becoming a comedian and they gave me a break through the Charlie Hartill Comedy Reserve. Without the Pleasance finding ways to bring new comic talent to Edinburgh the Fringe wouldn't be quite the same."

The company specialises in large-scale ensemble work, creating original shows with high production values delivered by our ambitious creative team. Having staged original productions for Edinburgh Festival Fringe for over 25 years, the company has established an excellent reputation with audiences and critics alike and launched the careers of many performers, writers, directors and technicians. CHILDREN'S PROGRAMMING AND KIDZONE

Over the past decade Pleasance has cemented its position as the place to see the world's best children's and family-friendly shows at Edinburgh Festival Fringe, with over **50,000 tickets sold** to families every year! Each year, the programme brings together adaptations of the best loved children's stories alongside brilliantly original work from exciting new artists.

The fun doesn't stop on-stage at the Pleasance. The Kidzone, our dedicated family area at the heart of the Courtyard, offers a family-friendly space for arts and crafts activities - the only venue on the Fringe that has one. The fantastic programme of practical activities, **suitable for all ages**, include award-winning music workshops, story hours, face painting, and a dedicated arts, crafts and play area (with plenty of toys!).

Our annual **Primary School outreach** initiative also takes place at the Kidzone, where **500 school children** and accompanying adults from some of Edinburgh's most socioeconomically disadvantaged Primary Schools are transported to the Pleasance to see a show, meet the performers and spend time in the Kidzone Art and Craft Tents.

STARTING CAREERS ON AND OFF-STAGE

Aside from our performance opportunities, the Pleasance provides a platform for people from all backgrounds to hone their skills in the creative industries by playing a vital part in the daily operation of the Pleasance's venues. With a focus on training and development, Pleasance provides teaching led by a specially appointed team of Senior Technicians, who each hold notable positions within the industry. A range of additional training and information sessions are offered throughout the festival, providing participants with opportunities to hone in on specific areas of interest through skills and knowledge-sharing based workshops with members of the Festival Management team.
